


Stay prepared for potential outages

During severe wildfire weather, power may need to be turned off in high fire-risk areas. This is called a **Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS)**. PSPS outages are a last resort to reduce wildfire risk and keep you safe.

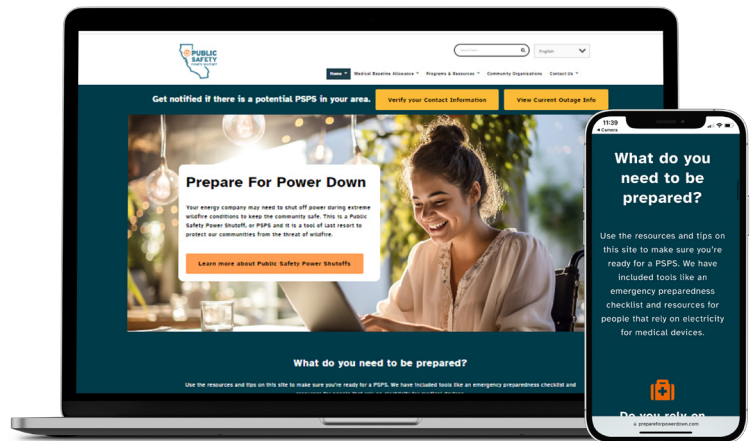
